IN THE BEGINNING!

Last week we explored a little bit about the identification the Father gives to Yahshua. In our observation in Scriptures we found over 25 passages both in the Older and Newer Testimonies.

It is very definitive that Yahshua is the "Son of YHWH." And it is revealed only because the Father (with His Spirit) opens our eyes to His truths.



Now, building on this information that is given to us from the Father we need to explore His Word more closely. That being said...

So we need help to discern other cultures and languages? _____

When referring to Scriptures we need to look at them from a Hebrew mindset or through Hebrew eyes. We must also take into consideration the times in which it was written

along with the who penned it. To whom it was written. Along with the underlaying mindset that this is the very Word of YHWH to instruct His creation how to have a close relationship with Him.

Let's begin with Genesis 1:1. "In the beginning Elohim created the heavens and the earth,"

Scripture starts with...Bereshit...translated, "In the Beginning."

Let's go back to some of the earlier paleo Hebrew wording to see what is being portrayed in the beginning of this text.

The first word of Scripture begins with the Hebrew letter Bet. In paleo Hebrew it is a house or tent. A dwelling for the family.

Bereshit is spelled in Hebrew...

First two letters, **Bet** and **Resh** form the word Bar...meaning

We see this as in Simon BarJonah (Simon son of Jonah [Jn 21:15])

Literal translation would be:

"The Son of God will be destroyed (or killed) by his own hand (or effort) on a cross."

700BC Isaiah 53:5 says... “But He was wounded for our transgressions; He was bruised for our iniquities:....”

Rev 13:8 “...The Lamb that was slain from the creation of the world.”

2nd word in Genesis 1:1...Created

It is the first verb in Scripture

Literal translation of Genesis 1:1 would be:

“In the beginning created God -the heavens and the earth.”

May seem odd in our English translation, however, in the Hebrew translation it reveals more meaning.

Created in Hebrew is

ברא

Bara from the same root word as bereshit

So ‘Created’ is literally translated:

Examining it more closely we see something significant (it all is... praise Yah). Circled above is the word that in English is translated 'with.'

The Hebrew word is more accurately translated, "next to."
